## A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT/CEO

As I reflect, I am incredibly proud of how our organization responded to serve the youth and families who needed us most during a difficult time in history. We witnessed firsthand, youth struggling to find their "new normal" in the wake of a pandemic, along with loss, inflation, sickness, and uncertainty affecting our communities. Despite the challenges facing our youth, we found an incredible spirit of resilience, staff going above and beyond to ensure our kids are safe and cared for, partners working together to bridge gaps in areas of need, and donors doubling down on the development of our future generation. Through it all, Boys & Girls Clubs of Acadiana remained the place parents and kids could count on. With the support of so many generous donors, we were able to focus on our mission to empower all youth, especially those who need us most, to reach their full potential as productive, caring, responsible citizens.

The last year was met with incredible opportunities to grow the Boys & Girls Club brand, reach more supporters, and serve more kids. In September, a leadership change was made with Missy Andrade named as Chief Impact Officer for Boys & Girls Clubs in Louisiana, a statewide organization created to support Louisiana Clubs through advocacy and fundraising. After joining the movement 3.5 years ago, I was honored to be chosen to lead the organization as Chief Executive Officer, committed to safety, quality, sustainability, and growth. Thanks to our incredibly dedicated and passionate Board of Directors, Boys & Girls Clubs are leading the way in youth development in the state.

Boys & Girls Clubs of Acadiana is expanding! Our mission expanded into Southwest Louisiana with the opening of the Cheniere Energy Boys & Girls Club in Lake Charles. After two devastating storms and subsequent challenges, the need for afterschool and summer care was vital for residents to begin recovery. With a commitment from Cheniere Energy, Chevron, Mayor Hunter and the City of Lake Charles, and countless others, we were able to open our doors January 2021. We continued to focus on areas of need and traveled north to Natchitoches Parish, where the Boys & Girls Club had closed in previous years. Under the charter of Boys & Girls Clubs of Acadiana, the City of Natchitoches, local advisory council, and major donors throughout the area were able to lay the foundation for a sustainable Club to begin serving kids March 21, 2022. More Club sites are on the horizon to ensure that young people have access to quality programs supporting academics, mental and physical health, and leadership. Our vision for the future has never been clear. We strive to provide a world-class safe Club experience that assures success is within reach of all young people with all members on track to graduate from high school with plans for the future, demonstrating good character and citizenship, and living a healthy lifestyle. The youth of today need a fun, safe place to learn and grow. They want ongoing relationships with caring, adult professionals, life-enhancing programs, and character development experiences. They deserve hope and opportunity for a great future. To all of you who continue to support our youth, thank you! You are helping to provide a place where the circumstances that surround our youth don't determine their opportunities.

## **BGCA PROGRAMS**

Project Learn reinforces the academic enrichment and school engagement of young people during the time they spend at the Club. Students do much better in school when they spend their non-school hours engaged in fun, but academically beneficial, activities. Through Project Learn, Club staff use all the areas and programs in the Club to create opportunities for these high-yield learning activities, including leisure reading, writing activities, discussions with knowledgeable adults, helping others, homework help, tutoring and games that develop young people's cognitive skills. Project Learn also emphasizes parent involvement as well as collaboration between Club and school professionals.

TRIPLE PLAY is a dynamic wellness program that is designed to help youth create opportunities to take charge of their personal health and wellness.

• Healthy Habits (Mind): Addresses the ways an individual's health behaviors are influenced by personal beliefs and exposure to positive modeling. In addition to nutrition education, activities focus on helping youth assess, practice, identify, consider, and recognize health behaviors and messages.

• Daily Challenges (Body): Intentional focus on physical literacy: Ability -

Increasing capability in basic movement skills and overall fitness; Confidence -the knowledge of the ability to play sports or enjoy other physical activities and Motivation- the intrinsic enthusiasm for physical activity for members to be physically active for life.

 Social Recreation (Soul): Emphasis on social and emotional development. or the social, cognitive, and behavioral skills that youth need to be healthy and productive. There is an explicit focus on emotional regulation, healthy relationships (with self and others), and responsible decision-making.

DIY STEM is a hands-on, activity-based STEM curriculum which connects youth aged 9 to 12 to science themes they encounter regularly. Special attention is paid to connections of theory and application and the common interactions members have with these scientific principles. DIY STEM currently includes five modules: Energy and Electricity, Engineering Design, Food Chemistry, Science of Sports: Football.

Summer Brain Gain helps prevent youth from falling behind and losing academic skills while school is out. It is comprised of one-week modules with fun, themed activities for elementary school, middle school and high school students that are aligned with common core anchor standards. As a result, kids develop higher-order thinking skills through the Summer Brain Gain modules while staying on track for the coming school year.

Power Hour: Making Minutes Count helps Club members ages 6-18 achieve academic success by providing homework help, tutoring and high-yield learning activities and encouraging members to become self-directed learners. Dedicated youth development professionals and volunteers supervise each session and help youth members complete their assignments for the day.

**Passport to Manhood** encourages boys age 8 to 14 to develop and mature into young men. Passport to Manhood represents a targeted effort to engage young boys in discussions and activities that reinforce

character, leadership and positive behavior. Each participant receives a "passport" to underscore the notion that he is on a personal journey of maturation and growth. Each of the program's 14 sessions use interactive activities to focus on a specific aspect of character and manhood. It also includes a service project where boys learn the importance of giving back to the community.



girls in three age groups, spanning ages 8 to 18. Through dynamic sessions, participatory activities, field trips and mentoring opportunities with adult women, Club girls explore their own and societal attitudes and values as they build skills for eating right, staying physically fit, getting good health care and developing positive relationships with peers and adults.



Career searching and finding the growth in life is the main priority at the Jackie Club. Career Launch in particular has been one of the most rewarding programs for our Teens. Our teens are challenged to begin to seek career paths in depth with an understanding of the "how to's" of the career pursuits. The character and educational commitment are learned and discussed in detail. Most of the teens leave these meetings with a greater appreciation of what it takes to establish a career and the ability they have to do so. A fun and interactive way the members find their interest and talents are through "Open Mic" and Talent Shows. "Open Mic" is an opportunity for members to start and drive conversations on topics that are important to them. It allows them to openly speak opinions and understand the importance of listening. Talent Shows allow teamwork and creativity to find talents within every member. The shows are unique and the emphasis is based on encouragement and supporting more than winning. The members are urged to do their best but understand it takes "us" to win and to lose gracefully.

### **Passport 2 Manhood and Girls Rock**

Passport 2 Manhood teaches males the aspects of positive manhood centering on career searching, gentlemen practices, and the use of life tools. Girls Rock is the female compliment that engages girls in etiquette, career setting, and discovering their voice as an effective communicator in what they believe in. Club members participating in these programs exhibit increased confidence, leadership, and apply all the lessons learned in their home setting with family members.





Not only does Zykeiveyun make an emotional impact on the club, but a physical impact of bringing in new members and being involved in their growth. Zykeiveyun assisted in creating a Teen Panel that resulted in the teen population increasing by 38% which took notice of the staff and positioned him in a leadership role teaching and coaching others. "The Club really changed my life, it gave me a place to go when things were going good and bad. Because of it, I got to visit places in and out of Louisiana. Inside the club, there was always someone there to motivate me to do better. As an alumnus now, I choose to stay active in the club becuase I want to encourage young kids the same way the staff encouraged me."

# CHENIERE ENERGY CLUB HOME

January 15th, 2022 marked the one-year anniversary of the Cheniere Energy Club of the Boys & Girls Club opening its doors to the youth of Lake Charles. Multiple partners such as Chevron and Cheniere Energy came together to provide mulitple opportunities to the first new expansion outside of the Acadiana community in nearly 20 years. Cheniere Energy donated \$100,000 to the club to establish the initial programming while Chevron paid for initial club membership fees for families interested in joining the club. SuddenLink also provided donations for their new STEM Activities. The STEM Activities are one of the favorite programs that provide hands on learning experience using science, technology, engineering, math, and arts. Their favorite thing to do within STEM activities is "Khoot! Khoot!," a game-based learning platform that they use to create, share, and play learning and trivia games. As the club is new, it creates new experiences and makes a huge impact on the communities that were once devastated by natural disasters and giving them hope for growth of the youth's futures. R.A., a member of the club says, "I like coming to the Boys & Girls Clubs because I can enjoy myself and have fun. Because of the Club I have been able to make new friends and learn all kinds of fun things." One of the parents stated, "My boys and I have enjoyed this experience to the fullest. I have seen their grades climb...and have been taught multiple life skills that will help them through life. They are around different walks of life while they are there and learning new things that us as parents are not always around to see. Each year, one member is selected from each club to compete for Acadiana Youth of the Year to then move onto state and regional competition to work towards the National Youth of the Year where they are named the Boys & Girls Clubs of America's national teen spokesperson.

In April, members completed the Youth of the Year process of providing letters of support, creating a resume and cover letter, as well as write several essays. In addition, they gave a speech on what the club means to them and went through an intense interview process with multiple judges. Zykeiveyun said that "as a result of this incident, I took pride in taking initiative in more difficult situations."

It made an impact on him by stating "I like being part of the Boys & Girls Club for the activities, the opportunities it gave me, but most of all the people.
